TEXAS CROCHET HERITAGE PANEL EXHIBIT

The *Texas Crochet Heritage* traveling exhibit was created by Suzann Thompson, based on her interviews, fieldwork, and archival research. It consists of forty-five 16 x 20" panels featuring photos, maker stories, history, and culture of doilies and similar items. The Texas Lakes Trail Region heritage and tourism office, affiliated with the Texas Historical Commission, published the exhibit in 2019. Since then, the Texas Lakes Trail Region office has distributed the exhibit to Texas museums, cultural centers, and libraries, as noted in Exhibitions and Competitions, page 5. The Texas Crochet Heritage exhibit was funded in part by a grant from the Summerlee Foundation.
